MINUTES OF THE PREPARATORY COMMITTEE MEETING ON H.E. PRESIDENT CLINTON'S VISIT TO RWANDA HELD AT KANOMBE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT ON 23rd MARCH,1998

1.0. Opening of the Meeting

- In the absence of the substantive Chairman, Hon. Minister P. Mazimhaka, the Deputy Chairman, Hon. Minister A.GASANA opened the meeting at 6:30pm.
- Requested members to read minutes of the previous meeting and identify matters arising.
- Called upon Amb. E.GASANA to update members on the status of the programme.

2.0. Briefing on the Programme

2.1 Programme

- Reported that in addition to the President, Vice President, Prime Minister and First Lady, Amb. Theogene RUDASINGWA and Mrs J. KAGAME will be present to receive President Clinton on arrival.
- Further reported that Mrs. C.M.RWAKA (S.G. MINAFFET) will escort flowergirls (Mbabazi Karegeya and Martha Murindangabo) to present flowers to President Clinton and First Lady Hillary Clinton.
- Informed that 70 flag-waving school Children will be on the tarmac to welcome President Clinton. There will be no soldiers for presentation of arms as earlier planned.
- Sitting arrangement of invitees remains the same
- Hon. Ministers P. Mazimhaka and Dr. A. GASANA will be the only ministers present in the VIP building; other Cabinet Ministers will be seated in the Departure Lounge of the main Airport building.
- Reported that also in attendance during presentation of testimonies by survivors of the genocide will be:
 - Prime Minister, Hon. Ministers P. Mazimhaka and Dr. A. Gasana, Major P. Karegeya, Amb. T. Rudasingwa, Mr. J. Bideri, First Lady and Mrs. J.Kagame on Rwandan side, plus a select team of President Clinton's entourage.
- Further reported that a motorcade of 10 vehicles will carry their Excellencies from the VIP building to the main Airport building where speeches will be delivered.

- Each speech is expected to last for 7minutes
- Decision on President Clinton laying the wreath at the Genocide Monument still hangs in the balance.
- Announced that H.E. President P. BIZIMUNGU will accompany President Clinton on his way back to Kampala.

2.2 Protocol

- Reported that there will be 289 invitees during the visit
- List of invitees to be approved jointly by Hon. Minister Dr. Gasana, Amb. T. Rudasingwa, Amb. E. Gasana and Major P. Karegeya
- (REQUEST CHIEF OF PROTOCOL TO GIVE SUMMARY)

2.3 Construction

- Reported that remaining construction work has been taken over by the Americans in the main Airport building.
- Reported further that Regie is repairing toilets in the same building.
- Informed that required chairs for invitees in the Departure Lounge have been obtained
- Further informed that VIP chairs will be brought and arranged by chief of Protocol.
- Construction of the Genocide Monument is complete. The casket at the monument will be covered with glass after placing in remains of the genocide victims.
- Reported that cultural troupes are continuing with rehearsals. Member of the Committee were invited to view rehearsals at Amahoro Stadium between 5.00 -6.00 pm.
- Testing proved that a part of the VIP building is still leaking.
- MINITRAPE directed to find a solution as soon as possible.

2.4 Communication

- Reported that everything is in order. There are no constraints worth reporting.

2.5 Mobilization

 Announced that due to security concerns by the Americans it was decided to withdraw invitation to the public. MININTER was requested to prepare Radio announcement to that effect.

2.6 Media

- 21 local journalists will be accredited to cover events of the visit.
- Announced that funds have been allocated for ORINFOR to broadcast proceedings of the visit.
- Reported that all accredited journalists will have a few minutes to take photos in the restricted VIP building.

2.7 Programmes and Budget

 Announced that checks were ready for those Sub-Committees which submitted expense claims.

3.0 **AOB**

- Reported that distribution of T-shirts and flags remains as planned.
- Further reported that extra T-shirts will be allocated to cultural troupes.
- Informed that persons earmarked to testify on the genocide have been identified
- On his way out to the plane, President Clinton will shake hands with 15 orphans who will be prepared for the occasion.

4.0 Closing of the Meeting

- Chairman thanked members for their attendance and announced that the next meeting will be tomorrow at 3 p.m. He declared the meeting closed at 8.55 pm.
