Native-Government Temporary Rest Camp, KABALE.

1. There is no P.W.D. Rest House at Kabale. Mud-and-thatch shelters have just been constructed on the camping site for the convenience of visitors and travellers. Public Notice (in the Gazette, etc.) recommends visitors to the District to bring camp furniture, cooking utensils and bedding, etc.
2. Fruit trees are being planted round the Rest House for the eventual benefit of travellers.
3. Infected malarial mosquitoes, exist both at Kabale and round Lake Bunyonyi. Mosquito nets should therefore not be forgotten.
4. To visit Belgian East Africa (Mandate) or the Belgian Congo, from Uganda, passports with valid visa are required (no less than if entry were by ship or train). Any porters crossing the frontier must be registered at 2/- Shillings per head, and rationed. Medical certificates are required by the Belgian authorities. Enquires and correspondence concerning local porters and their rationing should be addressed to local firms or agents (such as Victor & Co) and not to the District Commissioner, who has no authority to order porters except for Government Service.
5. Provisions can be purchased from Victor & Co. Kabale, and other shops. Meals and accommodation can also be obtained on the premises of Victor & Co.
6. (Running) water, for baths and kitchen, etc, is obtainable from the (Nyakambo) river at the base of the Station hill, immediately below the Rest Camp on the HUSHOROZA (R.C.M.) road. The best drinking water is further away, on the opposite of the Station.
7. A porter, for wood, water and odd jobs, can usually be engaged at a few hours notice by sending a boy to enquire from the (M'kiga) Sub-Chief of the Station, by name RWAKANYANGA. His house is on the main road Mbarara at the bottom of the Station hill, where the road forks.
8. Milk can generally be obtained through this Sub-Chief, given reasonable notice at 20 cents a bottle.
9. Eggs are usually fairly plentiful in the daily market at 2 cent apiece.
10. Firewood is, as can be seen by looking round, extremely scarce in the neighbourhood of Kabale. It can be purchased at 20 cents a bundle at the daily market. In emergency, a small amount can sometimes be got through the Sub-Chief of Station at 20 cents a bundle.
11. Food for native servants can be bought, easily and cheaply, at the daily market (7 a.m. to 1 p.m.)
