- In the Gazette, etc.) recommends visitors to the Matrict to bring camp furniture, cooking utensils and bedding, etc.
- 2. Fruit trees are being planted round the Rest House for the eventual benefit of travellers.
- Lake Bunyonyi. Mesquito nets should therefore not be forgotten.
- from Usanda, passports with valid visa are required (no less than if entry were by ship or train). Any porters crossing the frontier must be registered at 2/_ Shillings per head, and retioned. Medical certificates are required by the Belgian authorities. Enquires and correspondence concerning local porters and their rationing should be addressed to local firms or agents (such as Victor & Co) and not to the District Commissioner, who has no authority to order porters except for Government Service.
- 5. Provisions can be purchased from Victor & Co. Kabale, and other shops. Meals and accommodation can also obtained on the premisses of Victor & Co.
- the (Nyakambo) river at the base of the Station hill, immediately below the Rest Camp on the HUSHOROZA (R.C.M.) road. The best drinking water water is further away, on the opposite of the Station.
- A'porter, for wood, water and add jobs, can usually be engaged at a few hours notice by sending a boy to enquire from the (M'kiga) Sub_Chief of the Station, by name RWAKANYANGA. His house is on the main road Mharara at the bottom of the Station hill, where the road forks.
- 8. Wilk can generally be obtained through this Sub_Chief, given reasonable notice at 20 cents a bottle.
- 9. Eggs are usually fairly plentiful in the daily market at 2 cent
- in the neighbourhood of Kabale. It can be purchased a 20 cents a bundle at the daily market. In emergency, a small amount can sometimes be got through the Sub_Chief of Station at 20 cents a bundle.
